

## The Seventh Ripon Poetry Festival Under-11s Poetry competition 2024

You are invited to submit your poems to the seventh annual Ripon Poetry Festival competition. They can be serious or funny, solemn or silly. And they can be on any subject you like. But if you are looking for inspiration – how about writing about Hope? The wars in Gaza and Ukraine, climate change, the cost of living, polluted rivers, the refugee crisis, plastic in the oceans – at the moment we could all do with a bit of Hope...

The best of the entries will be collected in a book published during the festival. Everyone who has a poem in the book will receive a free copy of the book and be invited to read at the launch on Saturday 21 September.

You can submit as many poems as you want. Maximum length for each poem is 45 lines. Poems must be your own work and should not have been previously published. All entries are judged anonymously, so please do not include your name on the same page as the poem.
